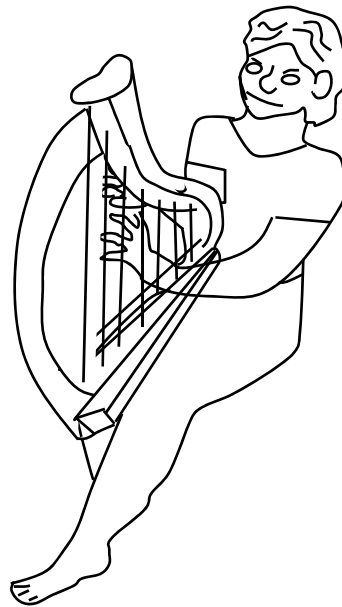

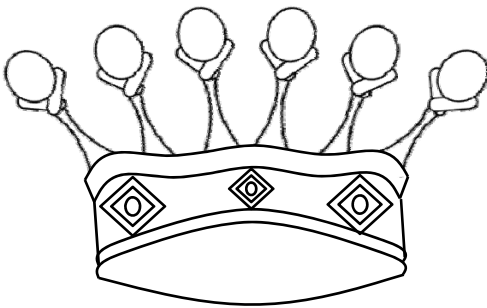

Jesse had a lot of sons. He showed his sons to King Samuel one by one.



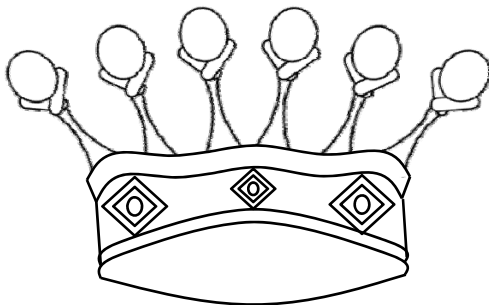

Samuel asked Jesse if he had any other sons. Jesse said he had one more son, but that he was very young and was tending the sheep.



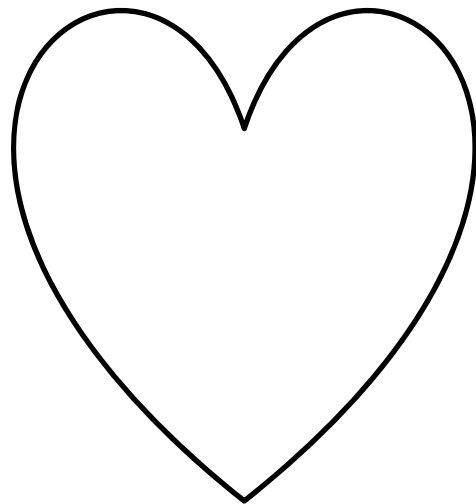
